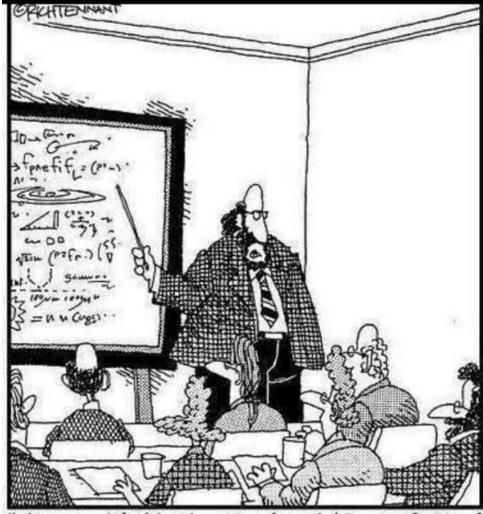

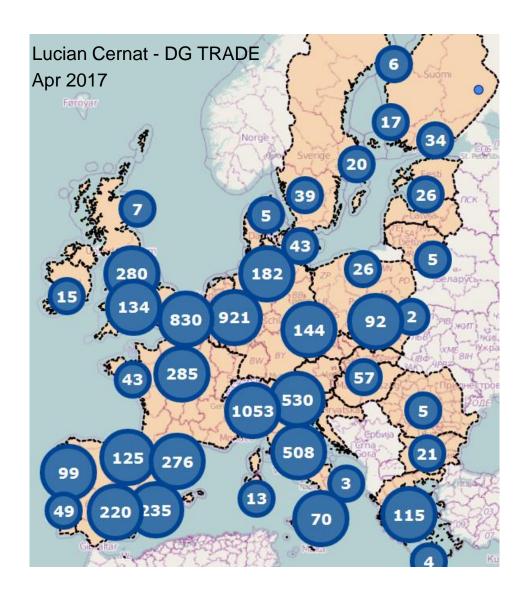
If firm-level trade statistics would be used more systematically, then trade policy could "come to your town".

Putting exporters on the EU map

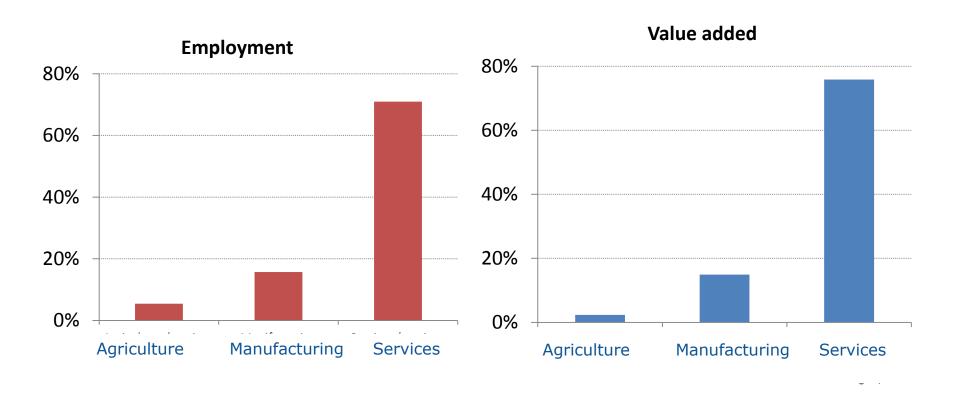
70'000 EU firms export goods to Canada. Most are SMEs!

Nearly **1 million** jobs in Europe are supported by EU exports to Canada

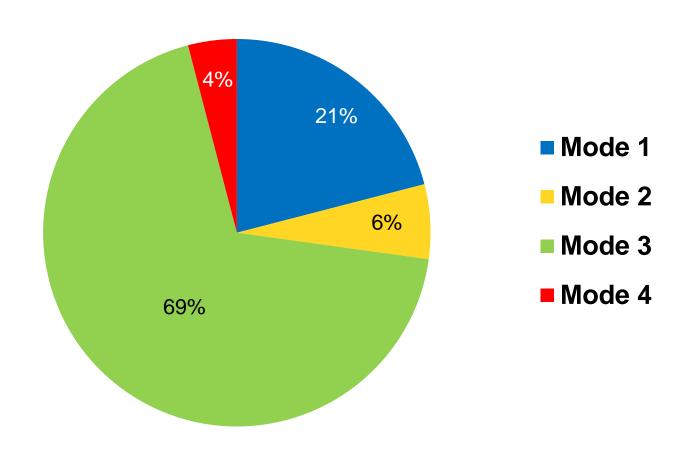

The relevance of services



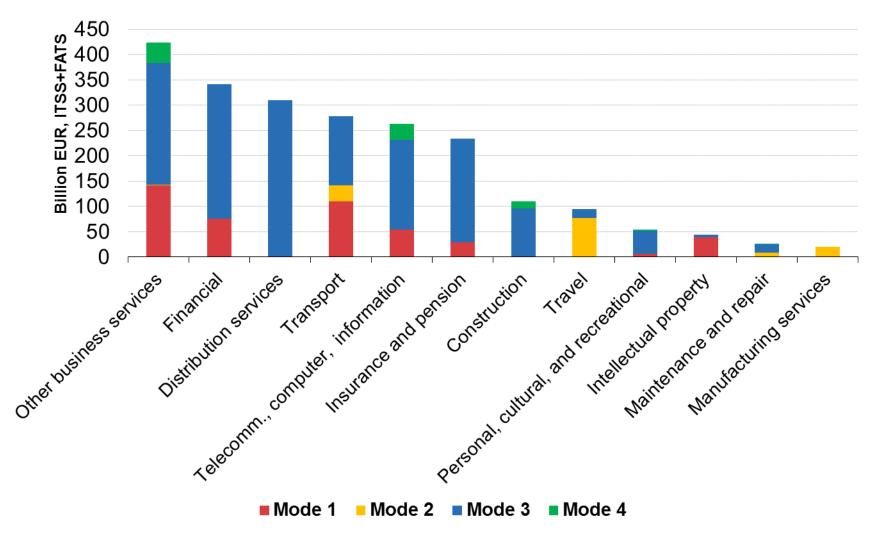
Value of EU services exports by GATS modes of supply

Top EU services exports

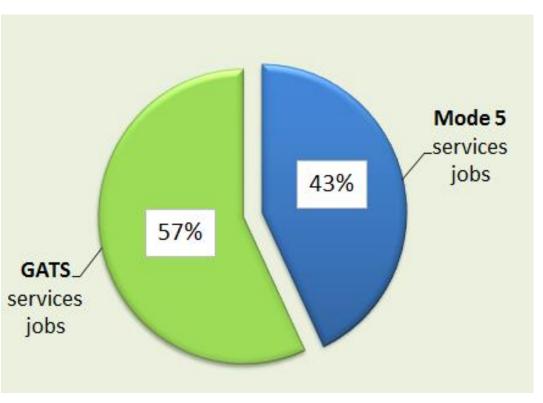
by sector and GATS modes of supply

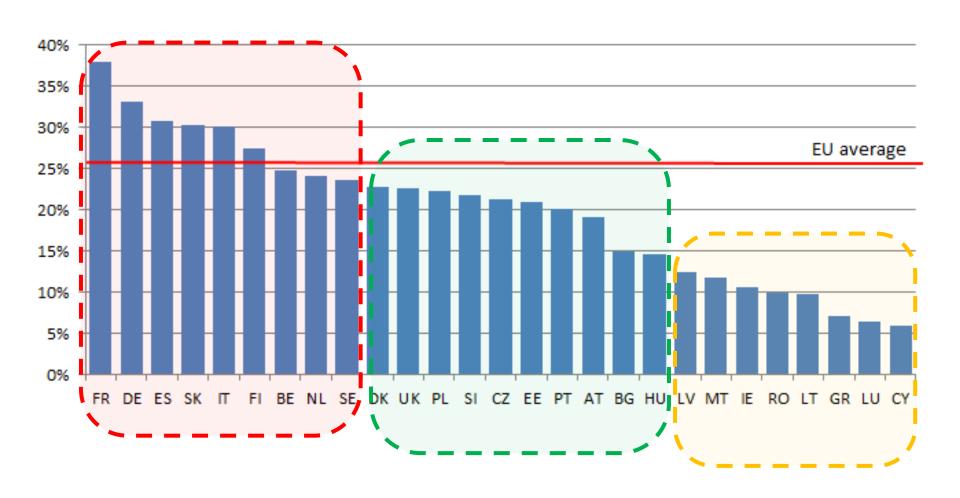
#Mode5services are more important than you think



- Mode 5- Services valueadded is exported in "boxes"!
- The services sector has almost as much at stake from manufactured exports as from their own "direct" exports
- The importance of services "exported in boxes" has increased a lot recently

Result: in Europe, there are more trade-related jobs in services than in manufacturing!

Issues for discussion

- Services are perceived as less traded than manufacturing but our usual stats show us only the "tip of the iceberg"
- Our services export performance cannot fly on GATS only, as sole "trade policy engine"
 - We export a lot of services embedded in goods exports (mode 5 exports). Except that they pay customs duties. Half a trillion euros worldwide in lost exports!
 - Barriers in GATS services are big, complex, behind-the-border and so far (very) difficult to negotiate away, apart from bindings and autonomous liberalization
 - We need to step up our implementation efforts and e-tools to services exporters – sometimes lack of transparency is the biggest barriers for services exporters
- We need firm-level services data to negotiate better, implement better, and show trade benefits "in your town"!
