









EXPORT & JOBS

EU Exports support 36 million jobs in 2017. 61% of export-related jobs are in services, That makes 22 million services jobs!




In 2017, **Europe** secured FDI projects up 10% over creating **353,469 jobs**.



Services also drive employment growth. In the EU, services account for over 70% of employment. Within the EU, services accounted for 62.7% of employment in 2000, by 2018 this figure had risen to 72.2%.

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Trade in Services 8 Investments

FDI is vitally important in enabling businesses to produce efficiencies via new technological developments and know-how brought in by investing companies. Furthermore, external investment is often crucial in developing new infrastructure that can require considerable sums of capital and expertise, particularly important for developing countries. FDI is also crucial for gaining access to new markets where a commercial presence may be needed. For European companies, expansion abroad through foreign direct investment can help European service providers to reach more consumers, ultimately creating new jobs and support competition within the EU and bringing new expertise to the business.








Mode 1: Cross-border supply Mode 2: Consumption

Mode 4: Presence of natural persons


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


Comparison between BoP & TiVA



EU Exports in TiVA - 2016 - %




Share of services in Manufactured products

Share of Services in Exports of Manufactured Goods (in Value added) - 2016



Most advanced FTAs are with Canada & Japan

The EU Canada CETA agreement and EU-Japan EPA offer improved conditions for services' suppliers, greater mobility for company employees, and a framework to enable the mutual recognition of professional qualifications, as well as elements of greater legal certainty for exporting and investing, and some new business opportunities in various services sectors.

SERVICES TRADE AND BARRIERS

PROTECTIONISM & LIBERALISATION

Despite the economic justifications for services liberalisation, services suppliers continue to be negatively impacted by discriminatory trade regimes in many countries. Barriers to services trade include:

- Barriers to commercial establishment (including foreign ownership caps and join venture obligations).
- Restrictions on types of commercial presence (branch / subsidiary) and number and type of services that can be provided.
- ✤ Discriminatory registration requirements and licensing procedures.
- Nationality and residency requirements.
- Economic needs tests and discriminatory treatment advantaging domestic compa over foreign companies.
- Closed sectoral market access.
- Non-Tariff Barriers (NTBs) such as technical barriers and complex regulatory environments.
